On Thursday, Dec. 3 from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m., guests are invited to go to La Mar where the restaurant will host an evening fusing art, music and technology together. Those in attendance will have the opportunity to meet Hense and discuss his artwork.

The nighttime programming also includes an exclusive performance by Pauchi Sasaki of Peru. During her performance, Ms. Sasaki wears a dress of speakers which enables her to play the violin live while electronic music is controlled through sensors worn on her hands.

Additionally, the menu at La Mar will be specially created for the event. For the menu's dishes, La Mer executive chef Diego Oka drew inspiration from the art and performance.

Last year, Mandarin Oriental, Miami highlighted its affiliation to Art Basel Miami as the fair arrived Dec. 4.

Guests of the property's MO Lounge + Bar got the chance to view an exclusive art exhibit Dec. 4-7, partnering with a local gallery to make the event possible.
