Lamborghini outfits Italian police with specialized supercar

Italian automaker Lamborghini is assisting the Italian Highway Patrol with a Huracn model developed with law enforcement in mind.

On March 30, the brand delivered a Huracn Polizia to the Italian Police, which has earmarked the supercar for use by the Highway Patrol in Bologna. Partnerships between police and automakers enable brands to give back to their communities while also raising their presence on the street.

Police cruiser

This Huracn joins another Lamborghini already in use by the Italian police since 2015.

Crafted in the Italian Police's official blue color, the vehicle features a V10 engine that can produce 610 HP. Made in aluminum and carbon fiber with all-wheel drive, the car can maintain stability even when speeding.

The interior is outfitted with a tablet, computer and a video camera. In addition to the technology touches, traditional police car equipment such as a gun holster, portable VHF radio and extinguisher are included inside.

Lamborghini also installed hooks for the police's classic red and white sign used to stop vehicles.

In addition to normal policing, the Huracán will be used to provide emergency medical support and transport blood and organs at top speed. The car features a defibrillator and a cooled system to house organs being sent for transplant.

While still not common, other governments have added supercars to their police cruisers. For instance, the Dubai Police has Ferrari, Lamborghini and Rolls-Royce models among its fleet, according to [Gulf News](#).

Other luxury automakers have become larger scale suppliers to law enforcement.

German automaker BMW won a bid to supply the Los Angeles Police Department with a fleet of BMW i3 electric vehicles.

BMW will provide the Los Angeles Police Department with 100 of its fully-electric vehicles to be used as part of the department's transportation fleet. The automaker secured the placement after a field trial where BMW i3s were evaluated alongside competitors' electric vehicles ([see story](#)).
