The Dalmore sells \$1.3K bottles in limited retail release

Distillery The Dalmore is taking its 25-year-old single malt Scotch whisky beyond bars and restaurants with expanded distribution.

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The Dalmore 25, part of the brand's Principal Collection, will now be released in limited quantities to retail stores across the United States. Beverage brands are making it easier for fans to get their hands on the bottles they covet, whether through expanded retail or ecommerce ([see story](#)).

Selling scotch

Beginning in August, The Dalmore will retail 1,000 bottles of The Dalmore 25 in stores.

With notes of marzipan, vanilla, fig cake and exotic fruit, The Dalmore 25 has a suggested retail price of \$1,300 for a 750ml bottle.

The whisky gets its complexity from the aging process. The spirit is first matured in American white-oak casks that once held bourbon. Next they are transferred to Palomino Fino sherry butts and 25-year-old bourbon casks, with the liquor divided between the two.

Finally, the whisky is combined and placed into Tawny Port pipes hailing from Portugal.

"As a result of the maturation process, the cask has a wonderful palate of orange peel, chocolate truffles and spiced gingerbread," said Richard Paterson, The Dalmore's master distiller, in a statement. "The Dalmore 25 is a truly spectacular addition to The Dalmore Principal Collection, and a must have for enthusiasts of the distillery and all whisky connoisseurs."

While The Dalmore 25 relies on a quarter century of aging, The Dalmore is currently marking a different milestone. The brand is releasing a special 50-year old whisky to celebrate an anniversary of the same age for its master distiller, along with a video to show consumers how it was done.

To continue with the theme of 50, The Dalmore 50 Year Old is priced at 50,000, or roughly \$53,202 at current exchange. The special whisky celebrates the 50th anniversary of master distiller Richard Patterson's work in the industry ([see story](#)).

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
