Amazon, Microsoft integrate voice assistants, share features across Alexa, Cortana

Voice assistant integration


While Apple was the first major tech company to introduce a personal assistant with Siri back in 2014, a number of other companies have responded with their own versions of a virtual assistant since then.

A year ago, Microsoft and Amazon announced that they would be joining forces and integrating features between Cortana and Alexa.

Now, as reported by CNBC, the deal is finally coming to fruition. Users of Microsoft's Cortana will be able to use Alexa functions, such as ordering off Amazon, and vice versa.

Voice assistants have become a major factor in consumers' lives, and some luxury brands have already begun to take notice.
