Fairmont commemorates peace and love for an anniversary

Fairmont The Queen Elizabeth in Montreal is celebrating its part in history with a series of on-location events hosted by British television personality Genevive Borne.



The hotel is spotlighting the 50th anniversary of when the late Beatles singer John Lennon and his wife Yoko Ono conducted a protest of the Vietnam War. The couple recorded the famous song "Give Peace a Chance" while remaining in bed at the Fairmont Queen Elizabeth, where this year events will be held such as a photography exhibit, guided tours and a Peace & Love party.

Peace and love

Fairmont hosted the famous singer-songwriter couple from May 26 to June 2 in 1969, as part of their protest for the war.

The Montreal hotel will encourage visitors to relive this moment in history with a special tour that will bring guests to the famous room. The tour includes a meeting with author Joan Athey and a look at the new design of "the most photographed door in the world."

Proceeds of the tour will be donated to Amnistie Internationale Canada Francophone, a group for the defense of human rights. The tour will be held on May 25 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. for \$19.69 a person.

Also on May 25 running until October, works from photographer Gerry Deiter will be on display in the lobby. Mr. Deiter was the one to cover John and Yoko's Bed-In demonstration.

At 10 p.m. on May 25, the hotel's Nacarat bar will host a Peace & Love party with DJ Jojo Flores with \$3 of every cocktail sale going to the Amnistie Internationale Canada Francophone. Guests are encouraged to wear their best hippie attire.

The following day Ms. Athey will be on-site to sign her book March Artisans from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., and again on May 27 from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.



In another in-hotel push, Vancouver's Fairmont Pacific Rim is drawing attention to its live music and new stage with a special campaign that includes a contest and a soundtrack production.

"Soundtrack to Pacific Rim Life" will be the hotel's album launched to celebrate its new state-of-the-art performance stage at its Lobby Lounge.
