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Spanish label Loewe turns to kabuki for spring summer 2020 womenswear book

Spanish fashion label Loewe has launched its spring summer 2020 womenswear publication featuring artist Fumiko Imano photograph herself and model Kaia Gerber in the grounds of Japanese-American sculptor Isamu Noguchi's Peace Garden.



Characterized by its ceremonial features, stone sculptures and bamboo, plum and magnolia trees lining streams and lily ponds in Zen arrangements, Noguchi designed his Peace Garden in the grounds of the Maison de l'UNESCO in the late 1950s to engender a feeling of meditative calm.

Ms. Imano cuts and pastes medium-format film to conjure herself an imaginary twin, with Noguchi's garden doubling up as a kabuki theater stage in which she and Ms. Gerber model Loewe's new spring summer womenswear collection.

The idea may not seem as farfetched since kabuki theater is intended as an escape from the everyday world.
