

Dior honors third batch of visual artists and photographers for young talents award

The 2020 Jury for the Dior Photography and Visual Arts Award for Young Talents deliberated at a distance to name 14 talents honored in its third edition.

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The honorees, which included 11 laureates and three jury mentions, showcased the works of these young artists, who reimagined the theme, "Face to Face." The goal is to highlight young visual artists from the top international art and photography schools worldwide.

The works were "imbued with liberty, meaning and emotion, they provided wild hope for the near future, for a tomorrow' that is coming," according to Dior.

Dior is conducting this effort in conjunction with [Luma Arles](#) and the [cole nationale suprieure de la photographie](#) (National School of Photography) in Arles, France.

Photo finish

Given the COVID-19 restrictions on crowd size, the artists cannot present their works in Arles, France as planned in July.

So, starting July 15, Dior and Luma Arles have decided to disclose them publicly to all in a digital exhibition on the Dior and Luma Arles Instagram accounts, as well as on the Luma Arles Web site.

A new digital project piloted by Luma Arles will contain the young artists' photographs and videos submitted to the jury.

Among other digital features will be filmed portraits of the winner, most of the laureates and jury mentions, access to the entire catalog online and several live talks with the jury and students.
