## Bulgari supports historic preservation in new exhibit

Italian jeweler Bulgari is reaffirming its support for preserving Roman history by helping unveil a new exhibit.

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Bulgari supported the restoration of more than 90 ancient Greek and Roman statues from the Torlonia Collection. The statues are now on display at Rome's Villa Caffarelli, which is open to the public through June 2021.

Restoring history

"The Torlonia Marbles. Collecting Masterpieces" exhibit features 92 restored sculptures, selected from the 620 pieces in the Torlonia Collection.

Bulgari sponsored the restoration work, which was completed by Fondazione Torlonia. By making the statues accessible to the public, the jeweler is helping larger audiences learn about the region's cultural roots.

The brand also shared a dramatic drone video of the exhibit.
