Four Seasons expands travel excursion portfolio

Hospitality group Four Seasons Hotels and Resorts is inviting travelers to embark on its newest Safari and Islands Collection in Africa.

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The offering includes hot air ballooning across the Serengeti, exploring the urban landscape of Johannesburg and beachfront adventures in Mauritius and Seychelles. From family celebrations to honeymoons, the breadth of experiences available across the region invites combination stays across multiple properties.

New horizons

To facilitate seamless connections across the region, the Four Seasons Safari and Islands Collection, Africa has collaborated with luxury private jet charter provider [ExecuJet](#).

Removing the need for international connections or overnight layovers, private jet travel in the region provides speed and comfort in a controlled environment, to allow for the maximum amount of time soaking in the destinations themselves.

In support of the Four Seasons Safari and Islands Collection launch, guests booking a private jet itinerary with ExecuJet between any of the properties, excluding the two Seychelles resorts, will benefit from a \$2,000 flight credit for all bookings made by November 2021, for travel by March 31, 2022.

A connection to the destination is central to each of the Four Seasons Safari and Islands Collection properties and during a stay, guests have opportunities to directly support local projects and learn more about the programs in place.

Ranging from wildlife conservation to energy saving, minimizing plastics and recycling, all properties have structured sustainability initiatives in place and a commitment to their surrounding communities through funding of local schools, orphanages and safe houses.

Additionally, Four Seasons' global health and safety program, Lead With Care, is in place at all properties, so that guests feel comfortable and confident that their wellbeing is a top priority.

Four Seasons has also been focused on expanding its presence in the Asia Pacific region ([see story](#)), and recently announced plans for the One Dojima Project in Osaka, Japan, which will include a new Four Seasons hotel.

The project, which began construction in August 2020, is a large-scale redevelopment project in the Kinki region of Osaka. The high-rise tower will feature residences by Brilliia, a meeting hall that serves as a base for tourism and business and the Four Seasons Hotel Osaka.

The hotel is being designed by award-winning interior designer Gwenael Nicolas of Curiosity, Shinichiro Ogata of Simplicity and Yasuhiro Koichi of Design Studio Spin. Nikken Sekkei, one of Japan's leading architectural firms, has been appointed to design the entire building.

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
