## Gucci hosts star-studded runway show on Hollywood Boulevard

Italian fashion label **Gucci** put on the ultimate parade celebrating love, complete with a star-studded cast and guest list.

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On Tuesday night, Gucci showcased a wide cast of musicians, Oscar-winning actors and more on Hollywood Boulevard in "Love Parade," highlighting more than 100 looks. The event held seats for 500 guests in a celebration joining Hollywood and Gucci ethos.

"This boulevard of stars lends perfect support to my uncurbed love for the classical world," said Alessandro Michele, creative director of Gucci, in a statement.

"Hollywood is, after all, a Greek temple populated by pagan divinities," he said. "Here actors and actresses are acknowledged as heroes of the myth: hybrid creatures with the power to hold divine transcendence and mortal existence at the same time, both the imaginary and the real."

The Gucci Love Parade called upon an impressive cast to model the looks, including Jared Leto, Jeremy Pope, Steve Lacy, Grace Johnson, Jodie Turner-Smith, St. Vincent, Miranda July, Phoebe Bridgers, Janaya Khan, Kodi Smit-McPhee, Macaulay Culkin, and Hayden Pedigo.
