British automaker Jaguar Land Rover is inviting consumers to bid on Bond James Bond in collaboration with auction house Christie's.

In channeling their inner 007, consumers will be able to bid on Defender, Range Rover and Jaguar stunt cars that were used in the James Bond film, "No Time To Die." The auction, marking 60 years of the iconic film franchise, will benefit the British Red Cross.

"Defender, Range Rover and Jaguar were in the thick of the action in No Time To Die," said Nick Collins, executive director of vehicle programs at Jaguar Land Rover, in a statement.

"Each car represents a unique piece of James Bond history which we're sure collectors will be keen to own and we are delighted to be able to support our charity partners through their sale," he said. "With such high demand for the Defender V8 Bond Edition, we are also hoping this special one-off version with the 60 years of Bond logo will attract a keen buyer."

No time to waste

The live auction for the coveted vehicles featured in "No Time To Die" will take place at Christie's in London on Sept. 28 and is an invitation-only event.

Two Defender and a Range Rover Sport SVR models are up for bidding.

The Defender 110, featured in all-terrain stunt scenes in the film, is estimated at 300,000 500,000 pounds, or about \$364,263 - \$607,020 at current exchange.

A Defender 110 V8 Bond Edition, of which only 300 were originally available worldwide, is estimated at 200,000 300,000 pounds, or about \$242,883 - \$364,263 at current exchange.

The Range Rover Sport SVR stunt car, which also was featured in a high-speed all-terrain chase in the film, was one of six supplied for production and is estimated at 80,000 120,000 pounds, or about \$97,108 - \$145,662 at current exchange.

To round out the exciting roster, the Jaguar XF was chosen by the film's stunt team as the ideal vehicle for a car chase and is one of two that appeared in the film's pre-credit sequence. It is estimated at 50,000 70,000 pounds, or about \$60,697 \$84,976 at current exchange.

Luxury automotive brands have always gone big for Bond.

Last year, British automaker Aston Martin celebrated its famous relationship with its favorite debonair spy in an exciting new vignette.

"Aston Martin x 007 License To Thrill" commemorates more than four decades of the exciting relationship between the automaker and James Bond. The action-packed vignette highlights the pivotal role of Aston Martin in Mr. Bond's heroics, generating viewer excitement ahead of the No Time to Die premiere in October ([see story](#)).
