Cartier names Amal Clooney to new 'Voices' collective

French jewelry maison Cartier is joining a famed human rights activist in pursuit of justice.



Lebanese-British lawyer Amal Clooney has been tapped as the first representative of the company's new charitable collective. With the announcement, Ms. Clooney joins "Cartier Voices," which aims to convene influential figures known for their philanthropic contributions in the interest of catalyzing change across the globe.

"I am honored to contribute to the Cartier Voices," said Ms. Clooney, in a statement.

"I look forward to building an enduring partnership founded on the values shared between myself and the Maison."

Winning women

Cartier's latest partner has been a human rights lawyer for two decades, working worldwide to represent survivors of mass genocide, political imprisonment and sexual violence.

With her husband, American actor George Clooney, she cofounded the Clooney Foundation for Justice, an organization dedicated to protecting victims of human rights abuses across 40 countries.

A trusted figure of justice around the world, Ms. Clooney serves as a Special Advisor to the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court, and was recently named *TIME Magazine*'s Woman of the Year in 2022.

Taking place in Paris, the leader will join Cartier's Women's Initiative Annual Awards Ceremony on May 10, 2023, as an event speaker.
