Italian luxury automakers pledge support to flooding relief efforts

Italian automakers Porsche and Ferrari have commented on the ongoing flooding in Northern Italy that has taken nine people's lives.



The iconic luxury car brands were set to participate in the Emilia-Romagna Gran Prix, the opener of Formula 1's Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup, from May 19 through May 21 in Imola before heavy rains necessitated evacuation. Porsche and Ferrari have pledged support for the affected area and the international racing leader's decision to postpone.

"The safety of fans, teams and all personnel has absolute priority," said Oliver Schwab, project manager of Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup, in a statement.

"In the current situation, going ahead with the Emilia-Romagna Grand Prix would also have tied up resources of the police and rescue services that are urgently needed elsewhere," Mr. Schwab said. "Our thoughts are with the people and the communities in the region."

Race against time

While Porsche has offered emotional support for those affected, Ferrari has donated one million euros to the Emilia-Romagna Region's Agency for Territorial Safety and Civil Protection.

Our thoughts and sympathies are with the people of Emilia-Romagna and Marche as they deal with the destruction caused by the heavy rain and flooding currently affecting the area.

The action comes in stark contrast to other luxury automakers' silence on the situation. The donation will be used to support environmental recovery projects once the flooding has subsided.

"In times of difficulty, Ferrari has always stood by its community," said Benedetto Vigna, CEO of Ferrari, in a statement.

"We wanted to provide a concrete and immediate response to the most urgent needs of the population of Emilia-Romagna, which has been tried by a serious environmental disaster."

Ferrari is based out of Maranello, Italy, which is in the same northern region affected by the flooding.

According to *Reuters*, this is the second time the Emilia-Romagna region has been hit by a torrential downpour in May, with the first occurrence at the beginning of the month and causing the deaths of two people.

The harsh rains come after months of intense drought in the area, which worsened the land's ability to overcome and absorb the immense precipitation, putting the entire region at risk for future devastation.
