LVMH-owned Champagne maker Veuve Clicquot is coming back to Australia.

Following the 2022 launch, fans of the maison can once again stay at the Hotel Clicquot pop-up experience in Noosa, Queensland. From Oct. 13 to 28, guests will be granted an exclusive culinary experience during their respective three-night bookings, eating dishes crafted by world-renowned chefs.

"Hotel Clicquot Australia is perhaps the ultimate expression of the optimism and joy that sits at the heart of our Maison," said Jean-Marc Gallot, president and CEO of Veuve Clicquot, in a statement.

"We are absolutely delighted to once again host the world's only Hotel Clicquot on the coast of Australia," Mr. Gallot said. "And what better location for the Hotel Clicquot than Australia, with its magnificent beaches and ebullient joie de vivre!"

## Return of Hotel Clicquot

Set on the coastline of Sunshine Beach, the temporary lodging immerses guests in the world of Veuve Clicquot and its products.

Customers can engage with the maison in a new light thanks to the hospitality framing. The move draws on the trend of experiential expeditions among luxury clientele, its location chosen last year as part of the brand's 250th-anniversary celebration.
