The Orient Express Corinthian sailing yacht, set to make its debut in June 2026, will feature a Guerlain Spa onboard at launch. Inside the 5,380-square-foot wellness suite, guests can enjoy a collection of exclusive experiences and treatments crafted specifically for the luxury vessel.
